## *The Repeal Pledge*

(Attorney General Candidate Version)

I pledge, if elected, to oppose all measures and efforts which would facilitate implementation of the health overhaul law enacted in March 2010.\*

I shall defend our state against all bills that would allow or advance the law's implementation, and shall initiate any necessary and appropriate action to block its implementation. I shall oppose measures accepting federal funds that could lock our state into putting provision of the law in practice.

I shall oppose measures and efforts that would facilitate implementation of the whole law or any of its component parts, including those that would impose mandates, restrict patient and doctor choice and control over medical decisions, violate individual freedom and privacy, reduce competition, create any new state or state-controlled bureaucracies or increase fees or taxes to comply with the law.
